

Yokohama, Lyon mark 55 years of sister-city ties; New partnership launched in economy, education

Hirofumi Sato, Chairperson of Yokohama City Council, and Makoto Kashiwazaki, Deputy Mayor of Yokohama, visited the French city of Lyon between November 18 and 22 to mark the 55th anniversary of the sister-city relationship. The following are reports on their trip.



1. Meeting with Lyon Mayor

Date: Thursday, November 20, 2014, 13:00-13:20

Venue: Lyon City Hall

Outline: Chairperson of City Council Sato and

Deputy Mayor Kashiwazaki met with Mayor Gérard Collomb. While looking back on the 55 years of the two cities' cooperative relations, they agreed to further strengthen their close ties and make this year a new start of their even closer partnership

for the two cities to keep growing together.




2. Ceremony commemorating 55th anniversary of sister-city relations

Date: Thursday, November 20, 2014, 13:20-15:00

Venue: Lyon City Hall

Outline: The ceremony was hosted by the City of Lyon and the Greater Lyon to celebrate the 55th anniversary of the two cities' sister-city relationship. Present at the ceremony were representatives from the City of Lyon, Greater Lyon, and L'Association Lyon-Japon Nihonjinkai (Association of Japanese residents in Lyon), and the delegation from



Following addresses by Lyon Mayor Collomb, Chairperson Sato and Deputy Mayor Kashiwazaki, performances were staged by the Kishine-Hayashi Troupe and hairdo and kimono dressing demonstrations by Iwasaki Gakuen Yokohama f College teacher, Hiromi Kakudate, and Akemi Wagatsuma, Iwakiya executive managing director, to introduce Yokohama's traditional performing arts and contemporary culture.

*Kishine-Hayashi Troupe, led by Doshun Watanabe, has been preserving Kishine-Hayashi, a type of traditional local festival music handed down in the Kishine-cho area in Yokohama's Kohoku-ku over a century, and appears on stage in many local events.

3. Kishine-Hayashi Troupe's performance

Date: Friday, November 21, 2014, 11:45-12:30

Venue: Lyon Museum Courtyard

Outline: Members of the Kishine-Hayashi Troupe staged performance of traditional festival music handed down over a century in Yokohama's Kishine-cho community. The troupe, which staged its performance in Lyon back in 2004 to mark the 45th anniversary of the sister-city ties, appeared on stage again before Lyon citizens. Thanks to cooperation by the Lyon Nihonjinkai, some 150 citizens showed up to watch the performance.




4. Conclusion of "Economic Partnership Agreement" with ERAI

Date: Friday, November 21, 2014, 10:00-11:00

Venue: ERAI Headquarters

Outline: The City of Yokohama concluded an "Economic Partnership Agreement" with ERAI (Enterprise Rhone-Alpes International). The signing was attended by ERAI Chairman Daniel Gouffé and Deputy CEO Pierre-Jean Baillot, representing the ERAI side, and Chairperson of City Council Sato and Deputy Mayor Kashiwazaki, representing the City of Yokohama. Yokohama and ERAI will promote their partnership in attracting companies' investment and business exchanges to contribute to the two regions' economic growth.



5. Yokohama business seminar
