

## Kyushu Shinkansen

The Kyushu Shinkansen, which is operated by JR Kyushu, first commenced operation between Shin-Yatsushiro and Kagoshima-Chuo in March 2004. The remaining section to Hakata opened in March 2011. The Kyushu Shinkansen service has considerably shortened the time required to travel between the Kansai and Kyushu areas by decreasing the travel time between Shin-Osaka and Kagoshima-Chuo from about 5 hours to about 3 hours and 40 minutes. As a result, people have increasingly shifted away from air travel to rail travel between the Kansai and Kyushu areas. The Kyushu Shinkansen, which carries around 14 million passengers a year, serves as a key mode of transportation in the Kyushu area.

In addition, the 66 km Nishi-Kyusyu route connecting Takeo-Onsen and Nagasaki is under construction and planned to open in 2022. This new route is expected to further increase trafic flows.




