



Save the date: Announcing SusHi Tech Tokyo 2024

Expanding on its successful 2023 event, Tokyo Metropolitan Government will bring together startups and city leaders from five continents to envision sustainable urban environments of tomorrow

Innovators and urban visionaries worldwide, take note. Over April-May next year, the Tokyo Metropolitan Government (TMG) will host SusHi Tech Tokyo 2024, a month-long exploration of how new technology, ideas and know-how can be leveraged to find sustainable solutions to the world's pressing urban challenges. More than 500,000 visitors are expected to join the many events that will unfold across the Tokyo Bay area.

The program centers on three components: The Global Startup Program, a massive meeting-of-minds of startups, investors, companies and municipalities; the City Leaders Program, in which city leaders from five continents will discuss challenges and solutions; and the Showcase Program, where visitors can experience innovative urban concepts first-hand.

For 2023, TMG has earmarked 28.6 billion yen to bolstering its startup ecosystem, with city tech being a key focus area. In February 2023, City-Tech.Tokyo, the first global startup event held in Tokyo arranged under the SusHi Tech umbrella, attracted 328 startups from 41 countries and regions around the world, with a total of over 26,000 attendees from 67 countries.

■ Global Startup Program

In November 2022, TMG announced its startup strategy "Global Innovation with STARTUPS." Under the slogan of "10 x 10 x 10 Innovation Vision to open the future", it has been working toward a tenfold increase in the number of startups, unicorns, and collaborative practices in Tokyo in the next five years. In February 2023, "City-Tech.Tokyo," one of the largest global startup events in Japan, was held at the Tokyo International Forum, attracting a total of 26,000 participants over two days. The next event will be upgraded as SusHi Tech Tokyo 2024: one of the largest events in Asia.

■ City Leaders Program

A new international network has been established in Tokyo to share knowledge and engage in discussion to find solutions to common challenges faced by cities around the world. In February 2023, leaders from 34 cities from around the world gathered for a summit-level meeting to discuss initiatives to solve urban issues, discuss future prospects, and to confirm collaboration among the world's cities. We will utilize the network we have established to create a sustainable society in collaboration with cities worldwide.

■ Tokyo Bay eSG Project

In April 2021, TMG announced the "Tokyo Bay eSG Project," which envisions the future Bay Area city 50 to 100 years into the future, and has since been promoting its initiatives. The aim of the project is to create a sustainable city where "nature" and "convenience" come together, and to realize the world's most advanced city in the Bay Area. This event will be a future showcase program that shares the project's philosophy and initiatives with society, and communicates Tokyo's sustainable urban model to the world.
