- 1st floor "Space"
 - This will offer an area for free activity with rich creative content such as the "Real World Only" space for experiential media art.
 - It will feature exhibits on the legacy of the Tokyo 2020 Games
 - Hands-on exhibits introducing the rich natural environment and wildlife of Tokyo will also be included
 - A plaza surrounded by the above exhibits will serve as a unique venue for workshops, lectures, project pitches, etc.
- 2nd and 3rd floor "Tokyo Innovation Base
 - This will be a base for startups and other diverse groups to interact and innovate through exchange and implementation.


Transit Access

■ Tokyo 2020 Games Legacy Exhibition and Competition Experience

The exhibit will also include a hands-on photo spot, and an Olympic and Paralympic Games experience corner that will use digital technology to allow visitors of all ages to enjoy the events.
