BUNRAKU 1st SESSION - BUNRAKU Performance in March -

Bunraku is a traditional theatrical art in which the voice of the tay \bar{u} (narrator), the music from the Shamisen (a three-stringed Japanese musical instrument), and the movements of the puppets fabricate to present a story.

The National Theatre will take on a new challenge, staging one of Bunraku's greatest masterpieces, "Sonezaki Shinjū," employing the background art for anime instead of the stage settings.

Under the visual supervision of puppeteer KIRITAKE Kanjūrō, the background art was created by OGA Kazuo, who has created the backgrounds for many classic anime such as "My Neighbor Totoro" and "Princess Mononoke." The premiere of the performances abroad.
