 politics and society in the aftermath of the election
- The two candidates have contrasting views about U.S. national interest
- The outcome of Senate and House elections will also be important

- Harris administration's approach
- Trump administration's approach
- The Ishiba government is unlikely to dramatically depart or deviate from existing policy
