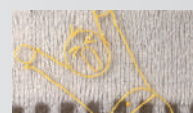

As AI-driven society continues to advance, our world becomes ever more functionalized, with possibilities for expression and means of communication diversifying and spreading at unprecedented speed. Yet this reality—often called the “digital twin”—has not yet reached the point where the analog networks forged by human sensibility have been fully transplanted into it.

In a sense, it is the exact opposite of the cave paintings our ancestors created in primitive times using nothing but raw emotion: humanity is now stepping into a digital sharing space built exclusively from mathematically processed information.

That is precisely why, right now, we creators must wield loving expressions rich with gradations that digital processing can never reach. Let us overcome this rigid, cookie-cutter age that mercilessly cuts away the weak and the vulnerable.

We are looking for talent that can build a future warm with human skin—talent capable of gently enveloping the future of technology itself.
